1.	<p><u>Welcome Remarks by Ms Kavita Gandhi, Executive Director of SEAS</u> Ms Kavita Gandhi welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked everyone for coming.</p>		
2.	<p><u>Welcome Remarks by Chairman, Mr Vinod Kesava</u> Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting and invited the group for a round of introduction.</p>		
3.	<p><u>Presentation by Mr Tridansh Pandey, Director, JTS Optimax Pte Ltd</u> Mr Tridansh Pandey presented on JTS Optimax and shared their experience in the carbon project journey, as well as bio-char as a solution to reducing carbon emission. Mr Pandey also shared on the future of carbon credits as well as its challenges companies will potentially face in the industry.</p>		
3.	<p><u>Update by Secretariat, Kavita Gandhi, Executive Director, SEAS</u></p> <p>Ms Kavita Gandhi shared on the upcoming activities that SEAS is planning, including the business mission to Dubai, Asia Clean Energy Summit and PowerACE competition.</p> <p>1. <u>Draft Carbon Pricing (Amendment) Bill</u></p> <p>After the brief update, KG shared on the Draft Carbon Pricing (Amendment) Bill where SEAS should consolidate members feedback to submit to MSE. Members of the group mainly shared that they need more clarification on 5% tax, another issue raised was the reason for excluding RECs, what would happen to the tax money after that and the definition of Singapore's high-quality international carbon credits (on whether it is CORSIA standard with corresponding adjustments).</p> <p>KG suggested that members should email to Secretariat by Monday, 1 August so that the Secretariat can consolidate it.</p> <p>2. <u>Carbon White Paper</u></p> <p>KG shared that the Carbon White Paper has been updated, and members can access it at SEAS Digital Learning Hub (Refer to Annex 1 for link).</p> <p>3. <u>Other activities: Decarbonisation pathways of industries</u></p> <p>Chairman suggested that for the next meeting, SEAS could organise a workshop with Data Centre operators to look at the energy efficiency factors on the measures to improve energy efficiency and reduce emissions.</p> <p>Vice Chairman also suggested to have conduct workshop to cover types of carbon credits, how to measure carbon footprint, how to decarbonise and common knowledge of corresponding adjustments.</p> <p>Other potential sessions that could be explored next year are with the Maritime (including Shipping Association), REDAS, Petroleum, Oil &amp; Gas, IETA associations to discuss their experience in decarbonisation journey. Inviting companies like TUV SUD could also be explored as a Singapore-centric workshop to share case studies on their decarbonisation journey.</p>	<p>Members to email Secretariat by Monday, 1 Aug.</p>	

	<p>SEAS member Singapore Polytechnic shared that they could host it at their space and invite other IHLs for the workshop.</p> <p>4. <u>Other activities: Market outreach to promote biomass</u> Members shared that there are not enough awareness for biochar in Singapore and it is a potential activity we could explore when we have enough traction in SEAS.</p>
